- a. Explain the following basic concepts of the law of evidence:

 - ii. Prima facie evidence (3 marks)

- b. In order to prove the existence or non-existence of a fact, several categories of evidence emerge. Describe any FOUR classifications of evidence. (10 marks)
- c. The law of evidence is of great importance to judicial proceeding. Discuss four functions of the evidence law in judicial proceedings in Kenya. (10 marks)

QUESTION TWO (20 MARKS)

- a. Distinguish between repudiation and re traction of confession in evidence law. (5 marks)
- b. Competence refers to the ability, capability or qualification of witness to give evidence in a court of law. Evaluate FIVE competences in special cases. (15 marks)

QUESTION THREE (20 MARKS)

- a. A privilege is a right which the law confers on a person by allowing him / her to refuse to testify in a certain matter or produce certain items as a real evidence. Discuss FOUR instances where privilege can be raised in court. (10 marks)
- b. Where a confession is repudiated or retracted by the accused or he/she maintains that it was not voluntarily, before the confession may be admitted, the court must conduct a trial within a trial. Describe the procedure of conducting a trial within a trial. (10 marks)

QUESTION FOUR (20 MARKS)

Admissibility of out of court confession is governed by the evidence (out of court confessions) rules. Discuss the rules. (20 marks)
